Lord Hayagreeva

The Embodiment of Higher Intelligence

Lord Hayagreeva – A Vedic Deity: The four vedas – Ruk, Yajus, Saama and Atharvana are the source of all knowledge in the world. They are the basic scriptures in Hindu religion. The word 'Veda' is derived from Sanskrit language, indicating knowledge or wisdom. It is this Vedic knowledge, revealed through stories in our later epics like Ramayana, Mahabharata (also Bhagavad Gita, a part of Mahabharata) and SriMath Bhaagavatam. To preserve this knowledge Lord Sri Maha Vishnu has incarnated in different avatars.



Hayagreeva, the sixteenth incarnation, is one among those which is less known divine avatar of Lord Vishnu. This avatar took place when *Vedas* were stolen by the demons (Madhu and Kaitabha) so He is considered as a Vedic deity of our Hindu religion.

Hayagreeva Meaning and Significance:

Hayagreeva is literally a two-word combination haya and greeva in which the word 'haya' means horse and 'greeva' means neck. He is also called as "Hayaseersha" or "Hayavadana". So Hayagreeva is an incarnation of Vishnu, depicted with a horse head and a human body, has 4 arms with one in the mode of bestowing knowledge, another holds books of wisdom (vedas) and the other two hold conch and discus, seated on a white lotus with His consort Sri Maha Lakshmi. Hayagreeva stays as an embodiment



of higher intelligence. He is the principal and presiding deity of all wisdom and knowledge. He is also considered as the guru of Goddess Saraswathi, the celestial patron of arts and sciences. It is believed that Sri Dakshina Murthy who is considered as first (*adi*) guru was also blessed with the power of knowledge (*vidya sakthi*) by Hayagreeva.

Lord Brahma also worships Hayagreeva on Hayagreeva *Jayanthi* (birthday). Students worship Lord Hayagreeva on this day for betterment of their studies in different parts of India.

Stories associated with Hayagreeva *Jayanthi* - There are many versions and references to Hayagreeva throughout the *Puranas*, *Mahabharata* and *Devi Bhaagavatham*.

One of the most common legends state that during the creation, after Lord Vishnu created Brahma, he taught Brahma all the eternal *Vedas*. Once Lord Brahma had mastered the *Vedas*, he was filled with pride that he was the

only entity that had the knowledge of all eternal and holy *Vedas*. Then Lord Vishnu thought of teaching Brahma a lesson and He created the two demons Madhu (*Rajo guna*) and Kaithaba (*Tamo guna*). Based on the instructions given to them, the two demons stole the *Vedas* from Brahma and carried them away to the underworld – *Rasaathala*. Having lost the *Vedas* (the light of knowledge), the whole world was surrounded by darkness. Unable to carry on his work of creation, without the *Vedas*, Brahma rushed to Lord Vishnu and pleaded for help to restore the *Vedas*, so Lord Vishnu then took the form of lustrous white horse faced Hayagreeva avatar and hurried to the underworlds, neighing loudly. The neighing of Lord Hayagreeva resembles *udgeetha*,

the music of Saama Veda. Then Lord Hayagreeva destroyed the asuras and restored the Vedas back to Brahma on Sravana Purnima (full moon day in August). This day is observed as his avatara-dina or Hayagreeva Jayanthi. That is why a special ritual called 'upakarma' is done on this day with special worships. He signifies as the restorer (protector) of Vedas from the clutches of ignorance. In the picture on the right, we can see Lord Viṣṇu in the form of Hayagreeva restoring the sacred Vedas that had been hidden in the depths of the oceans (Rasataala) to Brahma.



There is another narration in *Puraanas* on Hayagreeva related with Saint Agastya. In Kanchipuram, Saint Agasthya did a severe penance on Lord Vishnu and requested him to tell *Devi Mahatyam* (Greatness of Goddess). The Lord who was immensely pleased with his *tapas* (penance), appeared as Hayagreeva and blessed the Saint with *Devi stotras*. It is Lord Hayagreeva who taught Saint Agastya the two famous *Devi Stotras - Lalitha Sahasranama Stotra* (the 1000 names of Lalitha) and *Lalitha Trishati Stotra*. This is described in the form of instructions imparted to Saint Agasthya by Lord Hayagreeva in the 36th chapter of *Lalithopakyana* in *Brahmanda Puraanam*.

Lord Hayagreeva is considered important deity and being prayed in *Dwaitha sampradaya (madhvas)*.

<u>Description of Hayagreeva</u> - The great Hayagreeva appears as the white horse faced, flawless *sphatika* (white) hued form with *divya tejam* (divine valor). The *vedas* made up his shape, with a lovely long nose, like the heaven surrounded by white bright stars.

Bhumi (Earth) became his forehead, the upper world and the lower world became his ears, the rays of Sun were his mane, the Sun and Moon his eyes, Ganga and Saraswathi became his eyebrows, sandhya devatas (who endow both the day and night at a time) became his nostrils, pithru devatas (ancestors) became his teeth, Golokam (world of cows and animals) and Brahma lokam (world where Lord Brahma lives) became his two lips,

kaalaraathri (darknight) became his neck, his body built of all the great gods; in the middle of his head was Lord Shiva, in his heart was Lord Brahma, Agni (god of fire) was his tongue, the goddess Satya (Truth) his speech, while his knees were formed by the Maruts (known as the Marutagana and sometimes identified as storm or wind deities) and Varuna (god of oceans). The Vashu's and Sadhya's were his legs, in all his bones were other gods. The divya tejas sathva murthy Sri Hayagreeva thus, in a grandest beautiful manner praised in this way, by the different saints and ascetics.

The *vedas*, in the form of *mantras* and holy chants are very powerful sounds and these *mantras* contain *Beejaksharaas* (vital letters for education). Though we are not able to chant all the *mantras* and the hidden *Beejaksharaas*, a sincere prayer to Lord Hayagreeva will bring us all the power of learning. He feels pleased especially, when the below sloka from Hayagreeva stotra (Sri Vedaantha Desika) is recited.

Gnananandamayam Devam, Nirmalam Spatikakrutham | Aadharam Sarva Vidyanaam Hayagreevam Upaasmahe |

It is believed that one who chants the Hayagreeva stotram daily will become successful and be able to overcome all difficulties. He removes all our obstacles and blesses us with the most powerful and the greatest knowledge, which helps to achieve greater results. Lord Hayagreeva is thus the personification of all divine knowledge.

In our SV Temple, we have performed the unique Hayagreeva puja with Hayagreeva Homam on January 26th, 2019, under the supervision of H.H Sri Ahobila jeeyar swami ji from JET organization, with the help of our temple priests, local JET chapter members and community volunteers. Many families with kids participated in this auspicious event and got the blessings of Swami ji. Many people noticed the horse shaped flame at the end of Homam, which a good omen for all devotees is involved in this event. The SV Temple Management has decided to perform this unique event every year in summer for the greater goodness of Indian community and for the kids of future generations.

"Health Benefits of Vegetarian Diet

Vegetarian diet or vegetarianism is a very ancient custom among Indians and Asians, although recently this vegetarian diet has been gaining high popularity in the USA, Europe and all over the world. There is also popularity for Vegan diet among youth and teenagers, especially females and a lot of celebrities. Vegetarian diet has a whole range of diets practiced with varying degrees of restrictions, including Vegan diet. Vegan diet is more stricter, which contains less fat, low calories and more fiber so the vegans tend to be more thinner and have less health issues. Below are some Health effects of vegetarian diet:

Good effects: Many

Low risk for many heart problems, obesity, type 2 Diabetes and some cancers (colorectal cancer) and increases the intake of protective nutrients and phytochemicals (fruits and vegetables) for minimizing several chronic diseases.

Concerns: Some

The risk of having low bone mineral density (BMD) in women and men who continued to be vegetarians and vegans is the loss of bone density and strength which leads to fractures of hip and spine in elderly, due to not able to have enough calcium intake and Protein. Also, diets that contain purely vegetarian diets lack the long chain fatty acids (EPA and DHA) that are essential for cardiovascular health, brain and eye functions. In addition, the vegan will have more Zinc and Vitamin B12 deficiency issues that causes some neurological and emotional issues.

Recommendations for vegetarians and vegans to improve their diets to maximize their health benefits:

- 1. Adequate daily calcium and Vitamin D intake green leafy vegetables, calcium fortified soy and other fruit juices
- 2. To avoid Vitamin B12 deficiency fortified soy and rice beverages and daily vitamin B12 supplement.
- 3. Daily intake of foods rich in n-3 fatty acid ALA walnuts, canola oil, ground flax seed, soy products.
- 4. Avoid Zinc deficiency- whole grains, legumes, soy products.

In general, the decision to become a vegetarian / vegan is an individual one but depends on multiple factors including ethnicity, religion and health issues. It has more health benefits and few concerns so talking to a Dietitian or Nutritionist for planning a healthy diet is highly recommended.

Religious/Cultural Events since January 2019

New Year Celebrations - January 1st, 2019. Like last couple of years, this year also we have more than 2500 devotees visited the temple.
