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Shri Tallapaka Annamacharya—First Singer Poet

Shri Tallapaka Anamacharya - A saint-poet (May 9, 1408—February 23, 1503)

Shri Annamacharya, the greatest scholar of the Tallapaka family, was the mystic saint composer of the 15th century. He was known as the earliest singer-poet of South India.

Tallapaka Annamacharya, with his overwhelming love and devotion towards the Lord Venkateswara, composed and sang over 32,000 sankeertanas (only 14,000 available today), wrote 12 satakas (sets of hundred verses) (only 1 available today) and many other books



like Venkatachala Mahatmyam, Sringara Manjari, and Ramayana in Dwipada format. He was one of the first few scholars who brought social awareness with his keertanas. He chose Morality, Dharma and Righteousness as subjects in his Sankeertanas. He was the very first vāggēyakāra (Singer –Poet) in Telugu. He is widely regarded as the Pada-kavita Pitaamaha (grand old man of song-writing) and sankeertanacharya of the Telugu language.

Annamayya was the first to introduce bhajana sampradaya paddhathi in south India. In Kaliyuga, this is the most effective medium to attain salvation. Many south Indian mothers sing annamacharya's most famous compositions "Chandamama rave - Jabilli raave", "Jo achyutha nanda jo jo mukunda" to their kids as lullaby songs in his or her early childhood.

Annamayya's Birth and Childhood

Shri Tallapaka Annamacharya was born to Narayana Suri and Lak-kamamba on Vaishakha Shuddha Pournami May 9, 1408 AD in a small village called Tallapaka which is currently in Cuddapah District of Andhra Pradesh, India.

Narayana Suri and Lakkamamba had no children for a long time. Lakkamamba used to regularly worship Lord Venkateswara and plea for a child. They once visited Tirumala Temple for the divine darshan of Lord Venkateswara. While the couple were prostrating in front of the Dhwaja Sthambham (Holy Mast) a dazzling brilliance from the sword of Lord Venkateswara struck them like a lightening. Eventually a boy was born, Annamayya - who is believed to be



the incarnation of Lord Venkateswara's nandaka (Sword).

From his early childhood, Annamayya showed all signs of being a great devotee to Lord Venkateswara. As a toddler, he ate food or drank milk only after he was told that it was the prasadam of Lord Venkateswara. He would not sleep until his mother sang lullabies on The Lord. When Annamayya was five years old, his



father Narayana Suri performed his Upanayanam or thread ceremony, and got him ready for Vedic education. He learned it with ease and great dedication. The boy was able to talk about profound philosophies at that age. As born and brought up gracefully with inimitable divinity, Annamayya developed great love for music and devotional compositions.

Annamayya becomes Annamacharya

Though Annamayya was born in a Smarta family, he was greatly influenced by the hymns of Alwars and became attracted to Sri Vaishnava Sampradaya. He also became an ardent devotee to the gurus, like Shri Ramanujacharya and Vedanta Desika, of Shri Vaishnavism. Some of his songs are verbatim translations of Alwar's pasurams and Swami Desikan's Daya Satakam. Annamayya decided to have his Pancha Samskaram and completely converted to Sri Vaishnavism. From then on he became Annamacharya and devoted his entire life in the service of Lord Venkateswara in singing his glories.

His dream come true

At the age of sixteen, with his unbroken love and worship towards Lord Venkateswara, Annamayya once had a vivid dream in which he saw the Tirumala temple complex. In that dream, he also saw the Lord in His full glory along with His crown, conch (Shankhu) and discus (Chakra). Anna-

mayya described this dream in one of his compositions. From then on he started writing and composing sankeertanas with great devotion towards Lord Vishnu. Having realized his dream and purpose of his life, Annamayya decided to move to Tirumala and started his journey. On his way, he visited several other important shrines and composed innumerable songs on deities like Rama, Krishna, Hanuman, Narasimha and Vitthala; as he viewed them all as the forms of Lord Venkateswara, the Ultimate Reality.



Blessings of Goddess Alamelumanga

Annamayya, on his way to Tirumala, reached one of the seven hills. There he was completely exhausted and fell asleep. In his sleep, he had another dream in which he had the darshan of Goddess Alamelumanga. She spoke to Annamayya in his dream as lovingly as a mother would speak to a child in pain. She advised him to walk the rest of the hills with bare foot and respect the sanctity of the sacred place Tirumala. Also, she gave him Swamy prasadam and nursed him as if a mother nourishes her child. Annamayya thought that this was a real incident and not a dream anymore. At that very instant, he composed a satakam (100 poems) on Alamelumanga called Alamelumanga Satakam which was his first, biggest and the only one satakam available today out of his twelve satakas.

With the blessings of Goddess Alamelumanga, Annamayya, renewed his energy, continued his journey to Tirumala and had the real darshan of the Lord in His full glory. He was stuck by the immense spirituality of the deity and spontaneously wrote several songs describing his love on Balaji swamy. He then decided to stay in Tirumala swamy sannidhi for the rest of his life.

His Marriage Life

Annamayya hesitated to get married but with his guru's guidance and advice he finally agreed to get married. With heavy heart Annamayya moved from Tirumala to Tallapaka. There he got married to his uncle's twin daughters Timmakka and Akkalamma. This life changing event made Annamayya to expand his thoughts to new levels of his compositions. The contribution of the Tallapaka poets was recognized by many other poets of future generations.

Sankeertana Bhandaagaaram (Treasury of Sankeertanas)

Annamacharya wrote his sankeertanas on palm leaves and later his successors got them engraved on copper plates. But for reasons not known, most of these copper plates were unnoticed and lay hidden for centuries in a niche of Shri Venkateshwara temple at Tirumala. In 1922, twenty-five hundred copper plates, comprising of about 14,000 sankeertanas and a few other works, were found in a



rock built cell, later named as Sankeertana Bhandaagaaram, opposite to the hundi (donation box). During his last days, he spent most of the time in Srihari Sannidhi organizing the Kalyanotsavas and Brahmotsavas. Annamacharya lived for about 95 years and when the time has arrived, his Jeevathma unified into Paramatma on February 23, 1503.

Tribute to Annamacharya all over the world

The Annamacharya Project was established by TTD (Tirumala Tirupathi Devasthanams) in the year 1978 with a view to propagate the Annamacharya's music and literature among public.

Indian Government also made many efforts to popularize Annamacharya. In 2004, annamacharya stamp was released by The Union Ministry of Communications.



To mark the birth place of Annamachar-

ya, many renovations took place in Tallapaka Village which is currently located in Rajampet town, Kadapa district, Andhra Pradesh. In the year 2010, the 108 feet tall statue of Shri Tallapaka Annamacharya was built and placed.

Annamacharya Jayanthi celebrations are taking place every year all over the world especially in Tirumala and in Tallapaka.

As part of this, our S.V.Temple also celebrates Sri Tallapaka Annamacharya Jayanthi celebrations with Annamacharya Aaradhana by singing his Sankeertanas.

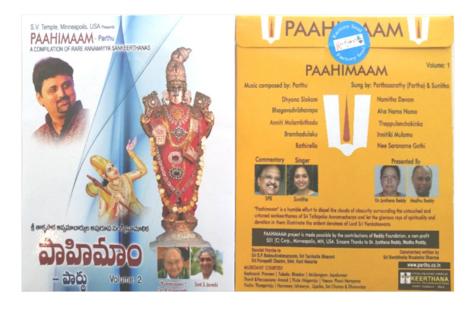






Swarakalpana of Uncomposed Annamacharya Sankeertanas

Vigraha Pranapratishtapana

Sri Venkateshwara Temple of Minnesota in Edina is happy to announce Pranaprathista of Sri Venkateswara Swamy, Sri Mahalakshmi, Sri Godadevi (Sri Bhoodevi), Sri Ramanujacharya and Parivara devathas from Aug 4th 2016 to Aug 7th 2016. Pranaprathista is the ceremony through which the sacred murthis are consecrated in a Hindu temple and the murthis are infused with the breath of life. These sacred rituals are complemented by a prescribed series of hymns, mantras, poojas and havans (Homams), in accordance of ancient traditions. During this celebration, the murthis representing the lords in various forms are immersed in water, bathed with an offering of milk and honey, and decorated with fragrant flowers. The Pranaprathista will be performed under the guidance of Sri Narasimhacharya, lead priest from California Sri Panchamukha Hanuman temple.

Mandala Abhishekam

As per Agama Sastra, after prana prathishta of Sri Venkateshwara Swami, it is mandatory to worship the lord with rituals. In order to attain the eligibility to conduct the offerings and rituals, the Maha Mandala Abishekam should be done after 40 days of Prana prathishta. Mandala means 41 days, so 41st day should be celebrated with Abishekam and other rituals including Kalyanam. It is believed that by doing Mandala pooja, it will bring auspiciousness to the temple and the community. SV Temple will perform the Mandala Abishekam and Kalyanam on September 15th.

Religious/Cultural Events since September 2015

Below is the recap of the cultural/religious events that took place since September 2015. We thank all the volunteers and organizers who made all these events a great success. We are looking forward to your support in the coming years.

Ganesha Chaturdhi – September 16, 2015. This year there was a special workshop for kids called 'Ganesha workshop' where kids made Ganeshas for Ganapathi Pooja. As every year, this year also a Ganapathi laddu was prepared by the food committee and was auctioned. All nine days special poojas were performed with Maha Ganapathi Panchaanika Utsavam. And on 9th day Ganapathi Navarathri ended with Ganesha Nimarjanam and Homam.

Diwali – November 10, 2015. Diwali, also known as the festival of lights. In order to bring the Indian community together, every year SV Temple invites devotees along with their families and friends to take part in the Grand celebrations of Diwali Festival. Temple management organize fireworks and food along with 5 days of Visesha Lakshmi Pooja. More than 2500 people attended.

Vishnu Shodasanama Stotram

Oushade Chinthaye Vishnum, Bhojane cha Janaardhanam, Shayane Padmanaabham cha, Vivaahe cha Prajaapathim, Yuddhe Chakradharam devam, Pravaase cha Trivikramam, Naaraayanam Thanu thyage, Sreedharam priya sangame, Duswapne smara Govindam, Sankate Madhusoodhanam, Kaanane Naarasimham cha, Paavake Jalashaayinam, Jalamadhye Varaham cha, Parvathe Raghu nandanam, Gamane Vaamanam Chaiva, Sarva Kaaryeshu Maadhavam, Shodasaithani Naamaani, Praathar uthaaya ya padeth, Sarva paapa vinirmuktho, Vishnu lokam samopnuyath.

Meaning:

The 16 names of Vishnu that one must chant when doing different activities in one's life. While taking medicine chant Vishnu nama, while eating - Janardhana, while sleeping - Padmanabha, at marriage - Prajapati, during war - Chakradhaari, on travel -Trivikrama, at the time of death - Narayana, with loved ones - Sreedhara, to avoid bad dreams - Govinda, while in sorrow - Madhusoodhana, while in the forest - Narasimha, while fire is raging - Jalasayina (Agnideva), while in water - Varaha, while climbing mountain - Raghunandana, while on the move - Vamana, for everything - Madhava. One who reads these 16 namas every morning will get rid off all sins and attain moksha.
